**EPNO Budget & Workplan for 2012-13**

Included in this packet is a budget, workplan strategies, and a workplan for next fiscal year. There is also a review of expenditures for the calendar year 2011. The budget is matched to the ONI requested budget, which has a 1% cut to program funds, and the Neighborhood Small Grant funds cut in half. The budget requests are now being reviewed by the Mayor with his proposed budget coming out later this month.

These are drafts for your review and discussion, please let me know of any suggested changes. The group will get to review and recommend an updated budget and workplan at the June meeting.

**PGNA/LNA Boundary Dispute**

In the agenda poll, the group clearly decided to take a break from this topic. However, a boundary dispute has been filed by PGNA; we are now in the 30 day window waiting for the LNA response. Some of the decisions that will need to be made:

- \* What will be the public involvement process?
- \* Do you want to meet with the neighborhood associations together or separately?

- \* Who will facilitate the meeting(s)?
- \* Who will be allowed to participate at the meeting(s)?

* Mark White – Upcoming meeting on zoning along 122 <sup>nd</sup> ; started a Farmers Market committee; concern about the danger of cars driving into the Ed Benedict skatepark; will be doing a SnowCap food drive at their NNO/movie in the park, are challenging other neighborhood associations to see how much food can be raised.	
* Bonny McKnight – Proposed cuts to TriMet service would reduce only service to Western States University; working on opposition to a group home in Centennial, there is already saturation of group homes in the area.	
* Nick Christensen – Supported maintaining funding for Leach Gardens from PDC; two recent shootings near the New Copper Penny, will be discussing safety; Founders Day is last Sunday in August, may skip it this year.	
* Beverly Tobias – No meeting in February.	
* Brenda McSweeney – Doug Brenner was at their February meeting to talk about improvements to Glenfair Park, adding a walking path, benches and picnic tables; elected a new treasurer; planning the Spring Cleanup, looking for other neighborhoods to join them; need to set date for volunteer appreciation.

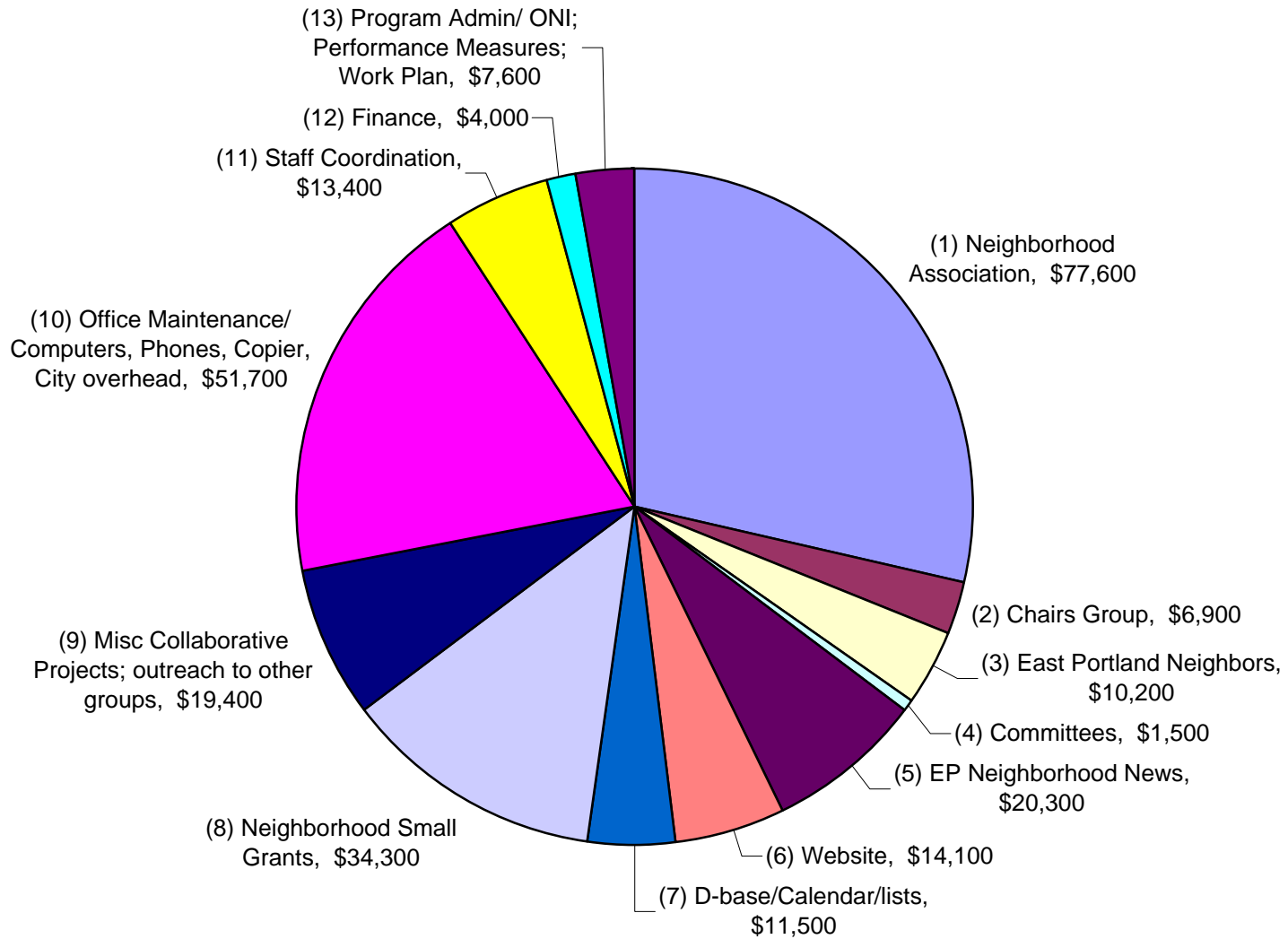

**EPNO Workplan Strategies:**

**1. STRENGTHEN COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION**

*Strengthen community capacity by developing Neighborhood Associations and the leadership potential of community members to initiate, coordinate and implement effective advocacy efforts.*

Support for leadership development will be offered through:

- one new board member orientation session,
- one neighborhood association board member gathering
- staff being available to work one on one with neighborhood leaders on organizational issues they face in building participation in the association,
- support for advocacy through the East Portland Action Plan and neighborhood committees, and
- support for neighborhood projects with the neighborhood small grants.

**2. INCREASE THE NUMBER AND DIVERSITY OF PEOPLE INVOLVED**

*Increase the number of people involved in neighborhood association activities, and the variety of perspectives held by those involved.*

Raise public awareness of opportunities to participate through neighborhood associations & other community organizations:

- the East Portland Neighborhood Association News,
- eastportland.org,
- supporting community events such as NNO, movies and music in the parks, and East Portland Exposition, and
- tabling at community events

Support for connecting with diverse individuals is offered through:

- Actively reaching out to other individuals and organizations in the community through the East Portland Action Plan.

**3. FOSTER NETWORKING AND COLLABORATION**

*Encourage partnerships between neighborhood associations and other community organizations to build broad community collaboration.*

Connect organizations and individuals in East Portland:

- a business liaison will maintain communication and look for opportunities to collaborate with the business associations and businesses in the area,
- neighborhood small grants will provide opportunities for individuals and organizations to work together on projects, and
- the East Portland Action Plan will engage schools, other agencies, individual community activists, and a wide variety of community organizations in working on common issues and interests.

### 4. PROMOTE EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION

*Encourage and facilitate communication among community members, Neighborhood Associations, and public and private agencies and groups.*

The communication strategy focuses on three different audiences.

**General Public:** East Portland Neighborhood Association News, eastportland.org, and tabling at community events are the key efforts at reaching the general public.

**East Portland Neighborhood Association News (EPNAN)** will serve as the coalition newsletter, informing the general public about activities and events of neighborhood associations. Communication funds for the neighborhood associations will be pooled to support this effort.

Policies for the EPNAN will be approved by East Portland Neighborhood Office with the recommendation and support of the East Portland Neighborhood Chairs Group. A goal is to mail the EPNAN to every household in the EPNO service area once each year to provide outreach. This can only be done with additional funding.

**Eastportland.org** will serve as another access point for information about neighborhood associations, committees and opportunities for participation. It will make information about the neighborhood office, neighborhood associations, committees, East Portland Neighbors, East Portland Action Plan, EPNAN, and Neighborhood Small Grants available on the web. A web committee with membership open to all interested parties will govern the structure, operation and maintenance, addition of new features, and umbrella policies for the website. Each organization will have control over and be responsible for the content in their domain. Eastportland.org will be promoted in the News, and at community events.

**Interested Residents:** Communication will be through the above efforts, and through neighborhood and committee mailing lists. These lists will be used to provide direct notification to interested residents about neighborhood meetings and activities. The lists will have both an email version that can be used for quick updates, and a mail version for those who don't use email. These lists will be used for notification when requested by the President or Chairperson of the group.

**Neighborhood Leadership:** Two email lists will be used to provide notification of possible opportunities for involvement, public involvement events by bureaus, and Coalition activities. The first list will be used extensively and will consist of the chair and vice chair of the neighborhood associations, and other interested parties. The second list will be neighborhood association board members and will be used less often for events or issues of more general interest.

My name is Jerry Gerspach and I am a Noise Analyst for the Noise Management Department with the Port of Portland.

I am sending this note to local neighborhood officials to make you aware of the seasonal traffic flow change that will take place this spring. This is an annual event that occurs every fall and spring due to changing weather conditions, particularly wind direction and speed. As a result of this change, residents of your neighborhood may experience variations in aircraft noise exposure.

I would also like to propose a presentation by our staff to an upcoming meeting of your neighborhood association to explain this procedure in more detail and answer any airport/aircraft related noise questions you may have.
